

## THE LACROSSE EXPEDITION.

Writing to a contemporary, the Captain of the Lacrosse Expedition, Dr. Beers, says:—

There seems to be every prospect of success for the lacrosse tour in Ireland. So far as is now known, the teams will probably play in Belfast on the 11th and 12th May, and in Dublin on the 13th and 15th. Glasgow is all ablaze over the visit, and the Caledonian Lacrosse Club have fixed the 19th and 20th; tickets, two shillings and sixpence the first day, and one shilling the second day. The Committee has been so alarmed (?) at rumors of a "big crowd," and hints that their ground would be too small to accommodate the people, that they have determined, at an expense of \$500, to take in an outlying rough ground, have it levelled, rolled and sown with grass. Gangs of men are now working at it. The efforts of Mr. T. W. Orr, the Honorary Secretary, formerly a Montrealer, have more than anything else contributed to the necessity for these preparations. I cannot say where else in Scotland our tour will extend.

Our first entry in England will be at Newcastle, where many of our old cricket and boating friends promise us a great success. In London, the ground at Hurlingham has been secured for 3rd June; the Oval ground for the 5th, morning and afternoon; Lord's cricket ground for any Saturday in June; Alexandra Palace and Richmond grounds.
