

CRESCENTS GO DOWN BEFORE SWARTHMORE

SWARTHMORE, May 4.—In the greatest game of lacrosse in the history of Swarthmore the Quakers this afternoon defeated the veteran team of the Crescent Athletic Club, of Brooklyn, by the score of three goals to two. The New Yorkers did magnificent stick work and excelled in all the finer points of the game, but were outdone by the superior condition and aggressiveness of the collegians.

The fighting was almost entirely about Swarthmore's goal, all the Quakers' scores being made on quick passing down the field. F. McVaugh was Swarthmore's star, his strong defensive work probably saving the game. The attack also worked well together. For the Crescents Captain De Casanova, Kennedy, Dobby and Miller did especially notable work.
