## MADDREN TO COACH J. H. U.

### Boys Will Have Hardest Lacrosse Game With Swarthmore.

Dr. William Maddren, of Brooklyn, N. Y., the well-known former lacrosse player of the Johns Hopkins team, will assist in coaching the Johns Hopkins team for the hard game with Swarthmore College at Maryland Oval next Saturday. Dr. Maddren will attend some medical clinics at the Johns Hopkins Hospital while in the city.

The fact that Dr. Maddren comes to Baltimore to assist the local team is proof of the feeling among the members of the Hopkins team that they have a hard fight on their hands to defeat Swarthmore, especially as the record of victories of the visitors' institution parallels the Hopkins record, and great confidence exists among the Swarthmore students and the Swarthmore team. While the Hopkins' work has probably shown up slightly better, the victories of both teams over Stevens Institute—10 to 0—would indicate that they are both picked as winners.
