## J. H. U. TO PLAY SWARTHMORE

### Will Decide Lacrosse Supremacy Among The Colleges.

The closing scene of the contest for the lacrosse championship of American colleges will be witnessed this afternoon at Maryland Oval, when Swarthmore will meet the last year's championship team of the Johns Hopkins University. The contests between these two teams have been very close for the last five years, and the Baltimore games have always brought forth a host of Swarthmore adherents among the graduates of that institution here.

Manager Branch, of the Johns Hopkins team, is very much disappointed that President Roosevelt, who had been invited to the game, will be unable to come on account of state business. A number of other public officials have been invited.

The Swarthmore men will arrive in Baltimore this morning. Both teams have an unbroken record of victories, and a comparison of the scores of each shows a very slight disparity in favor of the Hopkins team. Hopkins men realize that Swarthmore is a worthy opponent, as shown by the appearance of Dr. Billy Maddren, who has come all the way from Brooklyn, at the solicitation of the Hopkins management, to coach the home team. Mr. William Hodges, formerly of the Hopkins team and now a member of the Crescents, of Brooklyn, has written to Captain Tough to say that Swarthmore is to be feared by the locals, and Captain Tough, who has seen Swarthmore play this year, says that the latter's attack is fast and heavy. Swarthmore has a strong nucleus of old, experienced players on this year's team, including Mowrey at goal, Lamb at center, Turner at third defense and Hoopes at second attack. The Hopkins men are all in good trim, however, and hopeful of the result.

It will be the last lacrosse game played by Billy Bird, Freddie Blanck, Captain Tough, Howard Matthal and Swayne Putts as members of the Hopkins team, as they will leave the institution for good at the end of this year, and they have resolved to "cut things loose" on this occasion and show their friends how the game should be played.
