

# BLACK AND BLUE BEATEN

## Swarthmore Shows Superiority At Lacrosse.

### VICTORY IS WELL DESERVED

#### Hopkins Men Fail To Play Together As Well As Usual—Captain Put Out Of Game.

The lacrosse game to decide the college championship of the United States, which was played yesterday afternoon between Johns Hopkins and Swarthmore at Maryland Oval, resulted in a victory for Swarthmore. The score was 8 to 3. As the black and blue went down to defeat the great crowd mourned and the clouds wept. It began to rain soon after the game started and continued until the end. But the game was not stopped on that account, although the wet grounds rendered most of the plays very ragged.

Swarthmore had not won from Johns Hopkins for three years, and came to Baltimore this time with the best team it has had for many seasons. A lot of rooters came along also. The team was composed mostly of big, strong men, and they outplayed Hopkins in a way almost without precedent.

The Hopkins team was sorely crippled when Captain Tough, after a breezy discussion, was put out of the game on a technicality, and Pearre was hurt so that he had to limp throughout the rest of the game. He was injured early in the first half.

Swarthmore got the ball on the push-off, and in less than a minute F. Price shot a goal. Hopkins responded in a short time, when Strobhar caught the ball from Dill and, by some clever dodging, managed to score. It was one of the prettiest plays of the game. Bird and Dill made a number of beautiful plays, and Erlanger at goal played the game of his life. The Hopkins men failed to play together as they usually do, and defense, especially after Captain Tough was put out, was very weak, although Blanck played an excellent game throughout. Swarthmore deserved to win, and each of the eight goals was clean and the result of splendid judgment and clever playing.

The decisions of the referee caused several kicks from the Hopkins men. He was generally voted unsatisfactory.
