

# LACROSSE HONORS FOR SWARTHMORE

BALTIMORE, May 14.—In a heavy rain storm the Swarthmore team this afternoon defeated Johns Hopkins and won the inter-collegiate lacrosse championship, 8 to 3. The field was slippery and the men could hardly handle their wet stick.

Swarthmore's playing was of the rough-and-tumble sort, and the referee was kept busy deciding on charges of fouls made by the Hopkinses. In the first half Crowell struck Captain Tough during a hot play and the referee came near disqualifying both men. In the opening of the second half, in another mix-up, Captain Tough was struck by a Swarthmore player, and in return fouled the latter and was put out of the game.

The Hopkins men then became demoralized and failed to score in the second half. There were a number of brilliant individual plays by the Swarthmore men, Crowell scoring three goals and H. Price, who played first attack, scoring four. F. Price shot the remaining goal.
