Frank Grimes' Good Work.

Swarthmore, Pa., May 14. — The Swarthmore college lacrosse team and the Johns Hopkins twelve will play their annual game in Baltimore on Saturday. It is the last intercollegiate game in the schedule of both teams and as neither team has met with a defeat the game will be for the intercollegiate lacrosse championship of the United States.

Swarthmore has won the championship for the past two years and the Quakers have high hopes of landing the banner for the third time. Last year Swarthmore decisively defeated the Black and Blue by the score of 16 to 4. The Baltimore team, still smarting over the overwhelming defeat of last year, has worked hard for the game, and, aided by the advantage of playing on its own grounds, should make the Quakers play their best in order to win. By comparative scores both teams are evenly matched, and if the weather conditions are favorable, a fast, snappy game is looked for.

Swarthmore started out this year under unfavorable conditions. Only two members of last year's championship team came out to practice, and it was necessary to develop a team out of green material. The Quakers were fortunate, however, in securing the services of Frank Grimes, of Ottawa, Canada, as coach, and under his direction the team has developed with rapid strides, and it is now considered as being as good as last year's team.
