Toronto, June 3.—The Varsity lacrosse team arrived in the city on Sunday morning after enjoying a ten days' visit in Geneva, New York and Philadelphia, having played games with Hobart College, the Crescents and Swarthmore College. A date with Johns Hopkins University had to be canceled, owing to the inability of the Toronto team to wait over until June 8.

The feature of the tour was the second game with the Crescents on Decoration Day, when for the first time since 1904, Varsity defeated their American rivals, the score being 8 to 4. Eight thousand people witnessed this game, and, judging from the display of enthusiasm, Canada's national sport occupies no mean place in athletic circles across the border. At Swarthmore on Saturday the Varsity boys played their last game in a downpour of rain, but in spite of the pools of water and slippery mud, which covered the field, they succeeded in defeating the Quakers quite easily by 10 goals to 2.

The entire trip, although not as extensive as in other years, was one of the most successful and delightful in the history of lacrosse at Varsity, and in no small measure is this success due to the efficient management and able direction of Manager Whit Lalley and Captain Rudy Arens, whose tireless energy in the interests of their team, both on and off the field, won for them the esteem of all the players.

The personnel and positions of the team were as follows: Goal, Arens, (S.P.S.); point, Saunders (Arts); cover, Scott (Med.); defence field, Lailey (Med.), Lambert (Arts), Heal (Arts); centre, Brieker (Dent); home field, Campbell (S.P.S.), Davidson (Arts), Park (Arts); outside, Morrison (Pharmacy); inside, McSloy (S.P.S.).

Ivan McSloy, of this city, who played inside home, scored thirteen of the twenty-eight goals scored by the Varsity team on their tour. Only fifteen goals were scored against them.
