

BALTIMORE WINS FROM INDIANS

Swarthmore Lacrosse Six Nosed Out in Final Period

Unleashing a 6-goal attack in the final period after trailing 4 to 0, the Baltimore Lacrosse Club defeated the Swarthmore Indians 6 to 5 at the Walte Box in Swarthmore Wednesday night.

Diminutive George Alberts, former Hopkins star, dashed up the field four times during the final canto and slipped the ball past goalie Manning. Jack Taylor, another Hopkins man, and Walt Ives, former St. John's ace, each contributed a goal to the Baltimore cause.

The opening period found both teams checking hard and giving each other little opportunity to make goal shots. Finally near the finish of the period Percy Belfield shuttled the ball to Fellows directly in front of the goal and the first marker was registered.

The close guarding continued throughout the early part of the second stanza. Then Joe Kahler took the ball behind his own goal and twisted his way to the Baltimore net where he dropped the ball in for the second Swarthmore score. Then in rapid succession Bud Green, former Penn State luminary, shot two goals past the visitor's goalie after taking passes from Porter Walte and Johnny Belfield. Swarthmore went into the final period with a 4 to 0 lead that looked impassable.

The period was no sooner under way than Albert split the net for the first Maryland goal. Taylor sunk the next goal. Then Albert came down the box alone and after shutting a rain of sticks, pushed the ball past Manning for his second score of the evening. With their lead cut to a single point the Swarthmoreans turned loose a fast attack that culminated when Green scored his third goal of the evening after taking a pass from Blake. From then on it was all Baltimore. Albert and Ives scored with assists from each other. With the score tied and less than a minute to play the Baltimoreans swept down the field and after a general melee ensued before the net. Albert pushed his fourth goal of the evening through to decide the match.

Print Manning put on a great demonstration in the goal, stopping many shots that were labeled to score. Joe Kahler was a big factor of the middle period attack that the Swarthmoreans put forth. Bud Green showed well in converting passes into points for the home team.

A huge crowd witnessed the battle in which the Baltimoreans demonstrated why they had beaten eight of the best college teams in the field version of the sport this spring.
