**High-Flying Swan Gives UD All-America Man in Lacrosse**

It's been a long time since a University of Delaware athlete cracked the select circle of All-America distinction, but it appears certain that a wearer of the Blue and Gold is going to make the grade this spring.

Don Swan is drawing raves throughout the east with his fantastic production of goals in lacrosse.

The husky junior, a product of Swarthmore High, poured in 42 goals in nine games, is far ahead of any other college player for national supremacy. With three games remaining, it appeared that the former football tackle was well in line for a post-season nod from the lacrosse fathers.

Coach Milt Roberts attributes two factors to Swan's success. One is the addition of confidence, a blessing the Blue Hen ace lacked last year.

He's bring now whenever he gets the chance, and hitting on 71 per cent of his shots.

The other is his switch from the crease to the out home, equivalent to a change from the pivot to a forward's position in basketball.

Swan is big and fast, and his new position behind the goal allows him to utilize both qualities to the utmost.

He has a quick stick, fires without winding up.

He's left-handed, which doesn't untravel things for the defense.

He's been slowed down by double teaming, but then he was feeding little Gordy Bierman, another Swarthmore High alumnus, in the open enough to pile up 13 assists and allow his teammate to count 28 goals.

Swan hasn't fattened his total on weak sisters.

Except for one week marred by a charley horse that had him hobbling, he's been as consistent as polar weather.

His game totals read like this: Eight against Lafayette, two against Swarthmore, two against Drexel, three against Washington College, seven against West Chester, four against Duke, five against Virginia, five against VMI, and six against North Carolina.

During the Hens' southern jaunt, he poured in 20 goals in a week, and that's probably something of a modern record.
