

SWARTHMORE LOSES BY A SINGLE GOAL

**Oxford and Cambridge Lacrosse Players
Win a Fast Contest by More Effi-
cient Stick and Team Work.**

The English lacrosse team, composed of players from Oxford and Cambridge Universities, defeated the Swarthmore twelve at Manheim by 9 goals to 8. The game was fast and fiercely contested. It was through their more efficient stick work that the Englishmen came off victorious.
