Johns Hopkins Loses Lacrosse Championship.

THE SCORE IS 16 GOALS TO 4

Pennsylvanians Outplay Baltimore Twelve And Score 3 Points In As Many Minutes Of Play.

Philadelphia, May 13.—The Johns Hopkins lacrosse team lost the intercollegiate championship yesterday afternoon to Swarthmore College at Swarthmore, Pa., by the overwhelming score of 16 to 4.

The game was replete with brilliant plays by the Swarthmore twelve, and from the beginning it was seen that Swarthmore had the game won. It was practically a walk-over for the Pennsylvanians. They outran and outplayed Hopkins at every stage of the game. So fast did Swarthmore play that in the first three minutes three goals were made.

Swarthmore held the pace and had made six goals before Hudgins could penetrate her defense for Hopkins' first score. Snappy work resulted in this play, Hudgins receiving the ball well out in the field and advancing straight in on goal. Swarthmore continued her dashing work and made three more goals in this half. Strohbar scored again for Hopkins. Score, 9 to 3.

In the second half Hopkins made another goal, which was scored by Dill. On the other hand, Swarthmore made seven, the majority of these, as of those of the whole game, being made by Crowell. For Hopkins the work of Hudgins at third attack and W. Blanck at goal was admirable. The lineup:
